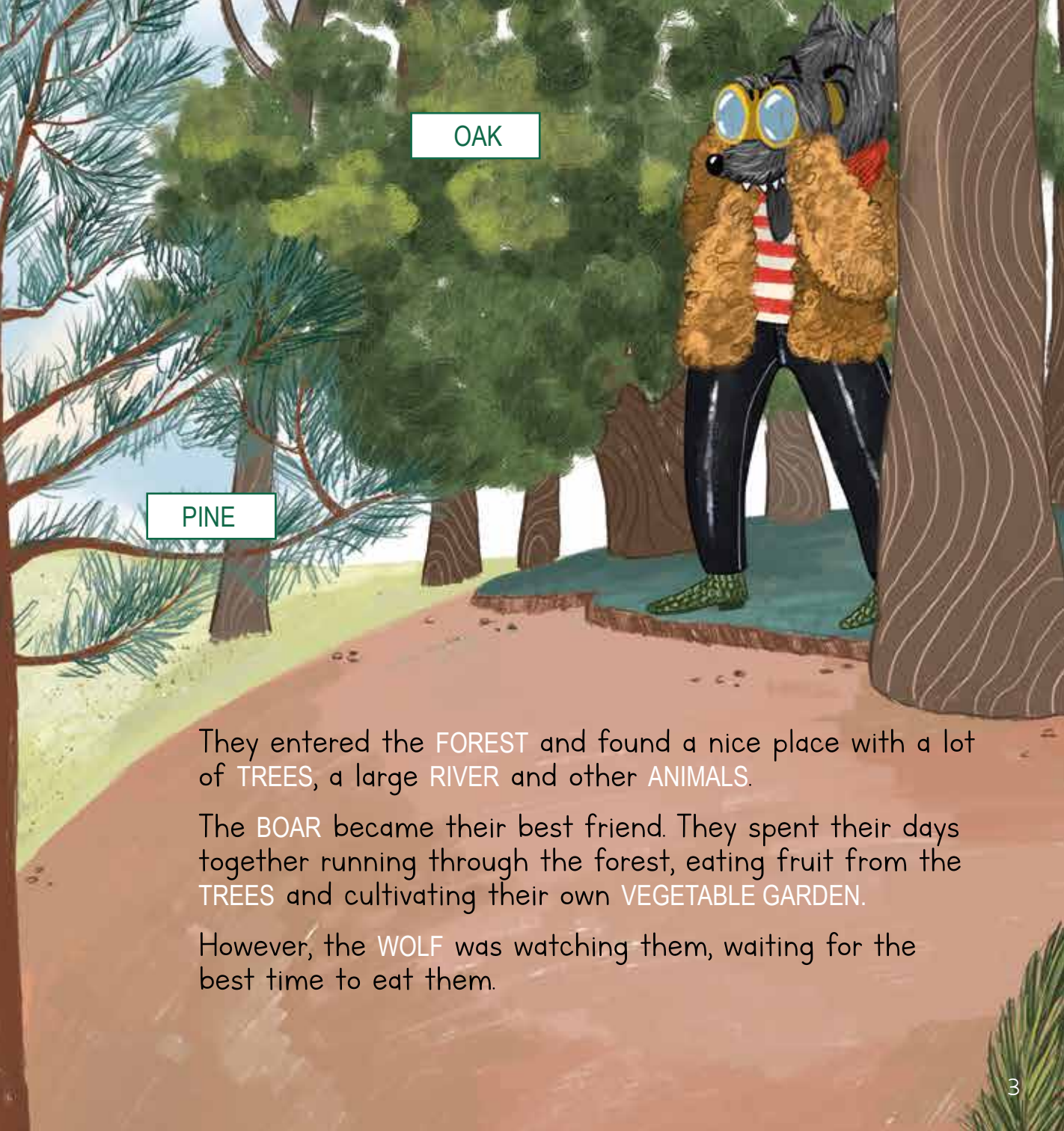
The three little pigs **MARÍA**, **QUINO** and **QUICO** grew up together, under their **PARENTS'** watchful eye.
